

Notes from Pastor Guptill

The death of my Father

I am in a fraternity of souls who have lost their last parent to time, history, and life. It is strange. For me, so many funerals for people in this place. So many men and women who have experienced the same transition and I am now with them. My father's life was a testament to a time no longer around. Those whose lives were so impacted by world war and industrial revolutions saw the world differently. Some of what they saw was harsh and uncaring. Some of it was more beautiful than words can express. The resurrection of Jesus is woven into this story, into all stories of death. Easter is not just a spring holiday. It means everything. For now, for me and for all who know this fraternity, the world feels different. The poet Diana Der-Hvanessian puts it in perspective:

When your father dies, say this Irish, you lose your umbrella against bad weather. May his sun be your light, say the Armenians.

When your father dies, say the Welsh, you sink a foot deeper into the earth. May you inherit his light, say the Armenians.

When your father dies, say the Canadians, you run out of excuses. May you inherit his sun, say the Armenians.

When your father dies, say the Russians, he takes your childhood with him. May you inherit his light, say the Armenians.

When your father dies, say the English, you join his club you vowed you wouldn't. May you inherit his sun, say the Armenians.

Praise be to God for the power of the resurrection, the light of Christ, the power of transformation. It is the Gospel.

Luther and Lutheranism Martin Luther (1483-1546)







Martin Luther was eight years old when Christopher Columbus set sail from Europe and landed in the Western Hemisphere. Luther was a young monk and priest when Michaelangelo was painting the Sistine Chapel in Rome. A few years later, he was a junior faculty member at a new university in small-town Germany, intently studying the Scriptures, "captivated with an extraordinary ardor for understanding Paul in the Epistle to the Romans."

In these days Luther was tormented by the demand for righteousness before God. "I did not love, yes, I hated the righteous God who punishes sinners, and secretly, if not blasphemously, certainly murmuring greatly, I was angry with God." Then, in the midst of that struggle with God, the message of the Scriptures became clear, like a long-shut door opening wide. When he realized that a "merciful God justifies us by faith ... I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates."

What Luther discovered is the freedom of Christians trusting God's mercy in Christ. As he later wrote, "Faith is God's work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God. This faith is a living, busy, active, mighty thing. It is impossible for it not to be doing good works incessantly. Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that believers would stake their lives on it a thousand times."

This discovery set Luther's life on a new course —both his own life and his public service as a preacher and teacher. When a church-endorsed sales team came to the Wittenberg area in October, 1517, Luther was concerned that the promotion and sale of indulgences undermined the promise of God's unreserved mercy in Jesus and the faith that trusts that promise. His *95 Theses* or *Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences* became the first of a life-long stream of books, sermons, letters, essays, even hymns in which he expressed his confidence in this life-giving promise from God, the Gospel, and its liberating implications for all of life in church and society.





A Grace Fall Bazaar Update

The 20th annual Fall Bazaar will be held on November 11, 2023 from 9 until 1:30!

As in past years, morning coffee and rolls will be available starting at 8:30 on sale day and lunch featuring soup and sandwiches will be served from 11 until 1 at a price of \$7.00 for the special.





Again this year all families in the congregation are asked to donate 6 dozen or more CHRISTMAS cookies to be sold on <u>Cookie Lane</u> on sale day. The traditional, beautiful, festive Christmas cookies are the best sellers. Some examples of the favorites, but not limited to, are spritz, peanut blossoms, Russian tea cakes, and decorated cut-out cookies such as sugar and gingerbread. Last year about 500 dozen cookies were sold! Cookies will be sold at \$5.00 per dozen. Christmas cookies should be brought to the FLC before 6 p.m. on Friday, November 10.

<u>Harvest Sweets</u> bake sale needs bars, cookies(non-Christmas), fudge, other candy, breads, pies, drink mixes, and trail and snack mixes. Scandinavian holiday foods have been very popular. Canned items such as pickles, relishes, salsas, sauerkraut, and jams and jellies are excellent sellers. All bake sale and canned items should be brought to the Family Life Center before 6 p.m. on Friday, November 10. To all salsa makers, if possible please make a ½ pint of your salsa that could be opened and used for samples at the Bazaar.



The <u>Garden of Grace</u> needs garden produce such as pumpkins, gourds, squash, potatoes, apples, etc., as well as dried flowers and house plants. These items should be brought to the Family Life Center between Sunday, November 5th and Wednesday, November 8th.



<u>Silent Auction</u> This year again we have some wonderful items donated by members of our congregation, but more items are still needed for this year's Silent Auction. Items that have been sold on the Silent Auction in previous years include furniture, paintings, handicraft items such as knitted items or cross-stitched items, meat packages, firewood, themed dinners, dessert of the month, and quilts. After 1:30 p.m. on sale day, all remaining items will be organized by artist and will be available for those wishing to pick up their items. Any Items not picked up by 8 a.m. on Sunday, November 12^{th,} will be sold for half price on Sunday morning.

If you are asked to help in some capacity with the Bazaar, please say YES. You will be glad you did.







When Do We "Fall Back" In 2023?


