Check Out the Church Library!

<u>Section 1</u>: Fiction. These books are found in the tall books shelves and are in alphabetical order by author.

<u>Section 2 through Section 9</u>: Non-fiction. These books are found on the shelves under the window nearest the couch & chairs. The categories here include Biography, Reference, Faith, Family Living, Death & Dying, Self-Fulfillment, Wellness, and Social Issues. The library team does their best to put a book into the right category. Sometimes a book can fall under more than one area.

<u>Children's Books</u>: These books are labeled with A through E and range from pre-school through early teen. These books are found under the window and along the wall near the little table & chairs.

<u>Devotional Books</u> can be found on the spinning rack in the center Y shaped shelf. The devotional books can be taken home or read in the library and do not need to be checked out. Please feel free to donate any devotional books that you are finished with and are willing to share. Just place the book on the spinning rack for others to use.

There are also other books, videos, cassettes, etc. which can be found on the Y shelf and under the bulletin board.

To check out a book from the library please sign your name and date on the library card in the back of the book and place the card in the small brown wooden box on the shelf under the window. When returning the book to the library, just place it in the basket under the window and near the door. There is no due date, but we do request that books be returned when finished so that they will be available for others to read.

Newer books, seasonal books, books with a timely topic or other books of interest are placed on top of the books shelves to be easily and readily available for checking out.

We invite everyone to check out the library and check out some books!!

Come in and explore the church library - Lots of good reading awaits. Living Grace Library is open whenever the church is open. Come in anytime.

Please remember to return your finished books. The book you may have forgotten to return may be just the book someone else is patiently waiting to read. Thank you.





Grace Lutheran's Sunday School World Missions Project Lutheran World Relief School Kits

Every Year the Sunday School kids lead the congregation in a World Missions Project during the month of January. This year's project is **Lutheran World Relief School Kits for Kids!**

Education is one of the strongest tools that a community has for breaking the cycle of hunger and poverty. Education leads to a better life for children, their families and their communities. School kits contain essential supplies to help children learn in the face of many obstacles. Often, School kits provide normalcy in times of crisis.

The Sunday School kids will be setting up a booth in the Narthex of the church starting January 14th to display their artwork and projects. The congregation is invited to donate kit items (see detailed list below and photos) or money to help purchase items. Each person making a contribution will receive a pencil bag specially created by the students as a token of their appreciation.

A Thrivent Action Team grant along with your financial and supply contributions will make this project possible! Money collected will help purchase drawstring backpacks, additional kits supplies as needed and cover some of the cost of shipping to where the kits are most needed.

January 21st and 29th – Collection continues!

February 4th – Kids will pack the school kits during Sunday School

Saturday, January 6th, 2024 The Epiphany of Our Lord


The feast of Epiphany ("manifestation") concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. In Isaiah and Ephesians, that glory is proclaimed for all nations and people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love to all people.

Treasured by God

A newborn baby often elicits "oohs" and "ahs" from its admirers and yet developmentally, may be doing nothing incredibly remarkable—only able to focus on objects only about 18 inches in front of its face and prone to stare at any shiny object. Nevertheless, a newborn is a miracle to behold, filled with wonder for the world around it and desiring nothing more than to be fed, held, rocked, nurtured, and loved.

The gifts of the magi direct us away from the cute, cuddly, cooing baby Jesus by pointing us to who Jesus really has come to be. The magi offer gold, a possession of kings; frankincense, used in ritual to indicate the presence of the deity; and myrrh, an oil used at the time of death as well as for anointing priests. By their gifts, the wise men reveal the identity of this child: the king before whom nations will bow, the anointed high priest of God, and the suffering servant who will die for the ones he has come to serve.

The "oohs" and "ahs" we offer as we celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord are not simply for a cooing and cuddly baby Jesus but for a God who chooses to reveal God's love and mercy by taking human form. On this day, we celebrate that God's mercy is wider and deeper than we imagined and includes all people and all nations. All people—rich or poor, Gentile or Jew, straight or gay, male or female—are God's treasure, the precious ones for whom God is willing to die. What do we bring to honor our Lord before whom we bow? We bring the treasure of our lives poured out in praise of God and in service to others.

Sunday, January 7th, 2024 Baptism of Our Lord

In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. Through this great epiphany, Jesus fulfills all righteousness and becomes the servant of God who will bring forth justice and be a light to the nations. In the waters of baptism we too are washed by the Word, anointed by the Spirit, and named God's beloved children. Our baptismal mission is to proclaim good news to all who are oppressed or in need of God's healing.

The Power of a God Who is Humble

From the time Jesus first presented himself for baptism by John until today, Christians have puzzled over why Jesus had to be baptized. The act of baptism was understood to be an act of repentance and the cleansing of one's sins. John does not understand why Jesus, whose sandals John is "not worthy to carry" (Matt. 3:11) should seek to be baptized. Instead, John declares to Jesus, "I need to be baptized by you" (Matt. 3:14). Why should the Son of God, who is without sin, need to be baptized?

Frederick Dale Bruner, in *Matthew: A Commentary* (Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 2004), says that he considers Jesus' first miracle to have occurred at his baptism. The miracle is that Jesus was humble. The divine Son of God humbles himself by allowing John to baptize him. This act of humility is an act of obedience to God and solidarity with all humankind. Jesus has no sins to be forgiven. However, for us, he goes down to the river of repentance with all the other sinners to be baptized. Jesus' baptism, his first adult act as recorded in Matthew's gospel, gives us a clear indication of how Jesus will act for his entire life. The Son of God will come down with us, on our level, identifying with our needs. His baptism, then, foreshadows how his life will end, on the cross. In his death, Jesus experiences the worst we could ever experience as mortal humans. But, because Jesus united with us in baptism, we are united with him in both his death and resurrection. The barriers that separate us from God, including the barriers of sinfulness, mortality, and death, are broken by Jesus' obedience to God, through his humility to come down to us in the depths of our humanity.
